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I composed and wrote this new album entirely in English: a real turn after having sung Eastern European world songs for long years.

I wished to give a more universal and contemporary resonance to my words.

My songs were born at a moment in my life when I felt the need to return to the source, like a journey to the most intimate, a descent into an immemorial night, where the fear of the child reawakens, and the badly healed wounds reopen. These are delicate love songs, like letters of a revolt sent out to the void. Beyond the disappointment facing the infinite brutality of our world, my songs express the desire and the dream of a tender and welcoming place :

"A Place Called Love".

The arrangements by Csaba Palotaï, mixed with rock - a slow and serious rock - and an unfailing Slavic sensibility, combine the solemnity of Nick Cave with Zsuzsanna's airy vocals, which are reminiscent in places of another stateless blueswoman, Lhasa. By switching to the English language and adopting a more pop format, Zsuzsanna's songs, always accompanied by her faithful combo of excellent musicians, do not lose their elegance and ardour.

TRACKLIST

A PLACE CALLED LOVE - The song that gives the album its title is about the desire to fly to a dreamy place of tenderness, where hate never existed. It evokes the thirst for freedom that I experienced as a child, growing up in a country locked behind the Iron Curtain.

MOTHER - The first text I wrote in English, during the last weeks of my mother's life. I couldn't find the words in my mother tongue to describe the fear and grief I felt. This song was the impetus for the others.

I HURT YOU - A love song about the violence of not being able to understand each other as lovers. We are left with the question: "who will carry love to the other side".

YOUR BEAUTY - In praise of the fiery beauty of a teenage girl (dedicated to my daughter). *WATERFALL* - On a five-beat music, echoing my Eastern European origins, the metaphor of a waterfall: a mixture of strength and fragility. As are tears.

DEER - My translation of a poem by Attila Jozsef, a Hungarian poet who is particularly touching. Its original title is "Sorrow". It is the story of a young deer who has lost his antlers and regrets having become a lone wolf.

BREATH OF LOVE - A prayer for a 'breath of love', in search of inner freedom, in a gospel spirit. *STARS* - A meditation on the afterlife, on disappearance and the feeling of not belonging. All this with a pop arrangement.

STILL WAITING - Lyrics dedicated to all mothers, who wait forever for the return of their children who have left or emigrated. An intimate song.

MISSING YOU - With a light, pop tune, the words evoke the unbearable feeling of lack, as in a dream: the impossibility of repairing a toy, of finding a lost boat or of putting back together the pieces of an exploding love story.

BIOGRAPHY ZSUZSANNA



Living in Paris since 1996, Zsuzsanna Várkonyi was born and raised in Hungary. She was influenced by classical music - her mother was an opera singer - as well as by gypsy music.

Trained as an actress, she has worked in theatre and film, appearing in *Michel Winterbottom's* "Forget about me" in 1990 and *Philippe Garrel's* "Sauvage Innocence" in 2001. She composed the music for several films by *Hubert Sauper*: "Kisangani Diary" (1997), which she also co-directed, and "Seules avec nos histoires" (2001). In 2008, Nicolas Hulot chose her adaptation of "Parlez moi d'amour" for his film "Le Syndrome de Titanic". As a singer, with her group of musicians, she has given concerts at the Lavoir Moderne Parisien, the Maroquinerie, the Divan du Monde, the Cabaret Sauvage, the Studio de l'Ermitage, the CENQUATRE-PARIS, as well as on numerous National Stages and in Festivals in France and abroad.

In 2010, France 3 Corsica devoted a programme to her for "*Mezzovoce*". Currently, she continues to perform regularly in the theatre as a singer and actress with the *Compagnie Gabbiano*, directed by Thomas Bellorini ("Pinocchio", "À la Périphérie", "Le Dernier Voyage de Sindbad" and "Femme non réeducable" « Solo Andata »at BATACLAN 2021, 2022, at the CENQUATRE-PARIS in 2023). Three songs from his new repertoire accompany *Hubert Sauper* latest film "Epicentro", Sundance Grand Prix 2020.

FRÉDÉRIC NOREL / VIOLIN, PIANO

Violinist, composer, arranger and conductor, he divides his time between symphonic compositions, concerts as an improviser, and music for the theatre, television and cinema (Emmanuel Mouret, Ladislas Chollat, Florian Zeller). A bridge builder - as shown by his piece "Liaisons dangereuses" for symphony orchestra and jazz octet, premiered in 2016 at the Salle Gaveau by the Lamoureux orchestra, conducted by Laurent Goossaert -, he puts his knowledge of the symphony orchestra and his practice of oral music at the service of cross-disciplinary projects: from Dhafer Youssef to the Réunionese singers Maya Kamaty and Christine Salem

He won first prize in the 1997 Jazz à la Défense competition, and has also played with the Archie Shepp Attica Blues Big Band, the ONJ, Georges Russel's Living Time Orchestra, the Bernard Struber Jazztett, Rosemary Stanley, Deborah Herbert, the Indian singer Ravi Prassad... and released the album Dremseekers on the Métisse label in 2001.

SEBASTIEN GASTINE / DOUBLE BASS

An eclectic musician, he began studying jazz, improving his technique with American musicians passing through Paris, and began his career in various clubs in the capital. He then met Téofilo Chantre, a Cape Verdean singer and composer (Ce- saria Evora), whose group he joined and with whom he recorded three albums and toured in France and abroad. He then participated as a producer and bassist in the launch of Babx (French song). Many artists called on him for his eclecticism and his "swing", including Oxmo Puccino. A long-time friend and partner of Lucy Dixon, he finds in her songs the opportunity to express his taste for black music and jazz.

CSABA PALOTAI / GUITARE

STEVE ARGÜELLES / DRUMS, PERCUSSION

Together with Django Bates, he founded Human Chain. With a unique style of innovation and a deep knowledge of the instrument, he has played with Martin Speake, Dudu Pukwana, Gordon Beck, Don Rendell, Alexander Balanescu, Tristan Honsinger, Ig Henneman, Lee Konitz, and Steve Lacy. He appeared in Steve Beresford's orchestra for Kazuko Hohki's album Love in rainy days. The 90's saw him join another budding band, the one that took place in France with musicians like Benoît Delbecq and Noël Akchoté with whom he created The Recyclers. He also worked with singers Corin Curschellas and Camélia Jordana
